Where do our PTA funds go?

A portion of our PTA funds were recently allocated to our fabulous teachers. PTA has given each of Matoaka's 51 teachers (including grade-level teachers plus special education teachers, center teachers, enrichment specialists, and speech & guidance staff) **\$50 towards educational supplies**. The teachers are free to choose the supplies they most need for their class. What are teachers saying about these funds?

"Oh what \$50 can do! I chose 6 STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) projects for the 6 remaining months of the school year. I started with ideas purchased from Teachers Pay Teachers. I adapted those to fit first graders. Two of the ideas purchased have literature tie-ins. I will add that language arts part to the other projects. I purchased nearly all of the supplies needed for the 6 experiences. The children are going to LOVE it. This site allows for the purchase of resources and classroom ideas across the curriculum.
