Did you know that research indicates that missing 10 percent of the year or more for any reason, including unexcused absences, excused absences, and suspensions, places students at significant risk of negative outcomes, including academic difficulty and failure, increased involvement in the juvenile justice system and dropping out? The goal for every student is *regular attendance* - missing no more than 5 percent of school days, the equivalent of missing one day or fewer per month.
